As I explained at the last monthly meeting (April – 2010) it is becoming increasingly difficult and needlessly expensive to communicate effectively to the broad base of Association Members using an email format alone or do a conventional mailing via snail mail..

Consequently, the messages and information related to the Association will, from now on, be formatted as a web page.

To receive these messages, you can either (1) sign up for a simple email service that alerts you to new information. It includes a simple link to the appropriate page in the Association web site that you need to review in a timely way.

You can simply check the web page and click on the link related to **Important Information** in the **Main Menu**.

Over the summer and fall, we will be developing an up to date roster of members, including current email addresses. With your current email address, we can send a simple message with a link to the Important Information page.

The form for submitting your email address is being programmed now. In addition, the Meeting Registration Form is ready. It allows you to register online and pay for your meal. - or to register for the meal and pay by check when you attend.

Information regarding sponsorship in the form of a Banner Ad is available on the website. The Internet is playing an ever increasing role in the organization. It allows the sharing of critical information concerning the Fire Service and this Association. With the transition of communications to the web, the use of the Internet is becoming crucial.
